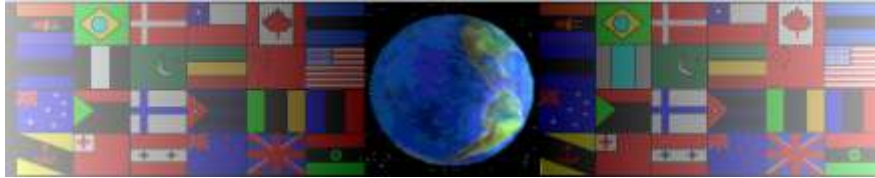

Study the design carefully.

State whether or not the design meets the Mackintosh design criteria, by completing the right side of the table, adding YES / NO and an explanation, against each criteria.



Functional, stylish and yet simplistic.	
Use of natural materials.	
Influenced by art nouveau, modernism and especially Japanese style	
Limited decoration, with pattern and ornament minimised.	<i>A colourful Mackintosh styled ceramic tile has been recessed into the lid.</i>
Use of floral patterns/motifs/forms, as seen in his stain glass designs, and applied to furniture.	
Use of texture, light and shadow - tactile.	
Powerful use of right angles, use of squares and rectangles with subtle curves.	
Combined materials such as stain glass and natural wood.
