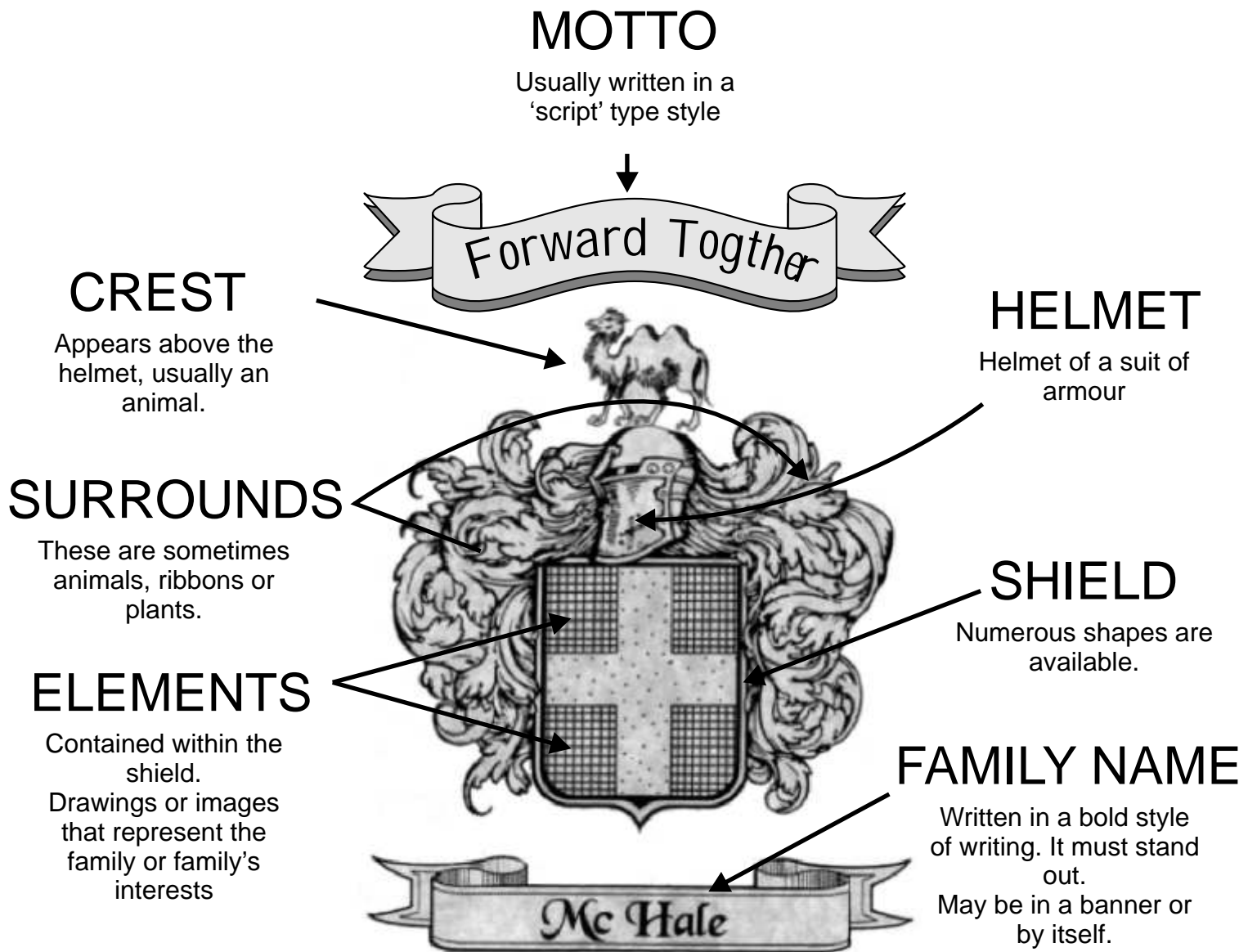

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LAYOUT OF A COAT OF ARMS

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A Coat of Arms is designed in a traditional way. Most designs have all the aspects shown in the diagram above.
