Study the existing symbol/logo. Do you consider it to be outdated or unsuitable? YES/NO

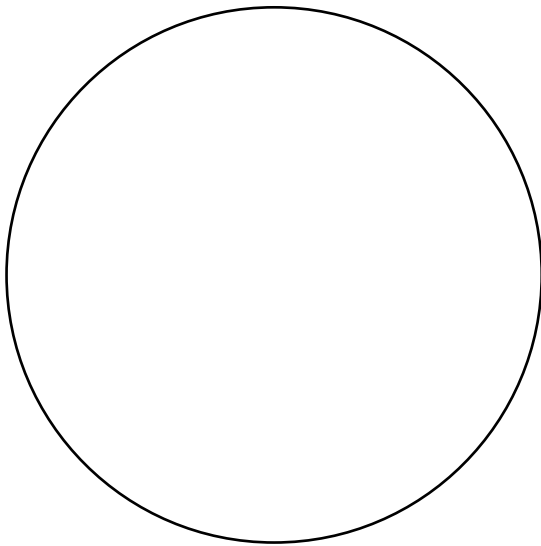
Explain your answer.

Produce two rough versions of a new suitable symbol/logo to encourage pupils to make each other smile. Add notes explaining each design especially how each one could be further improved.

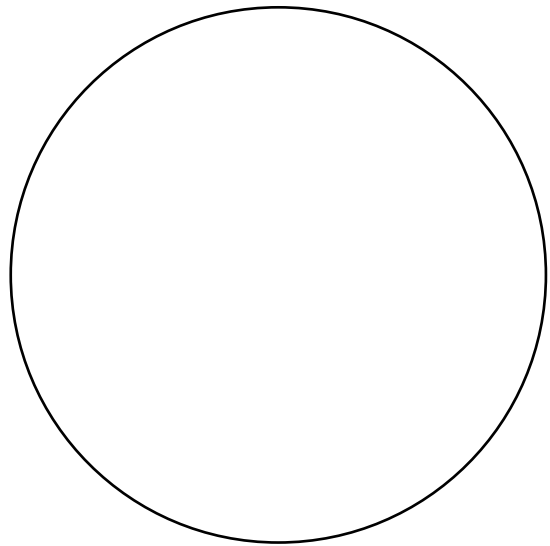
SUGGESTIONS:
