



INFORMATION: The symbol below (DIA 'A') advises a patient to use medicine night and day (twice over a twenty four hour period). Two new symbols have been developed from this symbol. The first advises the patient to use the medicine once during the day time. The second advises the patient to use the medicine once during the night time.

QUESTION: A pharmaceutical company has devised two creams to treat sunburn. One is to be applied during the hot summer days and the second during the cool nights.

Question: Design a symbol for each cream which emphasises when each one should be applied. Produce a rough design and a completed colour rendered version for each of your designs.
