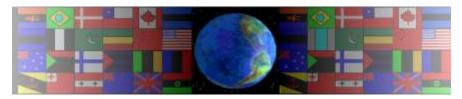

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
The bar code seen opposite is found on the packaging for the eye drops. It is plain and not particularly imaginative. The bar code could be improved by adding images and an example is seen below.
